WHO WE ARE

- Transit for all PA! is a statewide coalition of transit riders, transit workers, and transit-supportive organizations and businesses. Together, we are working to expand Pennsylvania's public transit systems to grow our economy and connect more Pennsylvanians to jobs, healthcare, and essential needs.
- Hundreds of riders and workers collectively built the Transit for All PA platform in 2021
- Since then, we have hosted petitions, led phone banks and town halls, papered every PA legislator, and rallied in Harrisburg, organizing nearly 10,000 riders, operators, and advocates

WHAT HAPPENED + WHY NOW

- In 2024, nearly 8,000 people took action to push the PA legislature to provide long-term, sustainable funding for public transportation.
- Following the legislature's failure, 3,000 PA riders and workers demanded Gov Shapiro take action in under two weeks.
- In November, Governor Shapiro agreed to move federal highway dollars to fund SEPTA and postpone fare hikes and service cuts
- SEPTA's runway ends on June 30, when other agencies across the Commonwealth will also face service cuts and fare increases

As early as July 1, SEPTA faces a funding gap of \$213 million. PRT needs \$100 million more next year.

STATE FUNDING STATUS

Service cuts in every community

Shapiro proposed a small \$\$ increase in his budget - the same as last year - but we need more

Fares increases up to \$3 per ride

MEETING THE MOMENT WITH ORGANIZING

- In 2010-2012, our organizing for stable, expanded transit funding wins us Act 89
- In 2020-21, our organizing to address the COVID transit emergency wins us hundreds of millions of dollars in COVID relief funding, keeping agencies from collapsing
- In 2023, we organized for the ability for local regions to raise tax money for transportation to access federal infrastructure bill \$\$
- In 2024, our organizing for increased funding for service won us a stopgap \$80 million for all transit agencies, and prevented SEPTA from hitting the funding cliff.

- 1. TO SERVE PENNSYLVANIA'S DIVERSE NEEDS.
- 2. THROUGH PROGRESSIVE MECHANISMS
- 3. WITH SUSTAINABLE, LONG-TERM FUNDING SOURCES.
- 4. EQUITABLY WITH ROADS & BRIDGES
- 5. WITH TRANSIT RIDERS AND TRANSIT WORKERS AT THE TABLE.
- 6. WITHOUT INFLICTING HARM OR FUNDING REDUCTIONS TO OTHER ESSENTIAL STATE SERVICES AND PROGRAMS.



 - In-person gatherings in Philly and Pittsburgh










FOUR PLANKS: SERVICE RESTORATION

- Restoration to 2019 service + 10% for rural and small city agencies
 - Nearly all agencies have cut service since COVID
 - For small agencies, even that baseline doesn't support riders - and legislators are noticing.
 - Ex: Carlisle outside Harrisburg lacks intracity service; Bellefonte outside State College's sole fixed-route is in danger of being permanently cut; Erie and Harrisburg themselves lack Sunday service entirely

SERVICE ACROSS PA SINCE COVID






FOUR PLANKS:

LOCAL CONTROL + SMART SPENDING

- Local enabling legislation
 - Allowing local communities to raise money for transportation projects
- Local control for transit fare enforcement
 - Currently, this is decided at the state level - allow local governments to make their own decisions
- Project Prioritization framework for PennDOT
 - Avoid boondoggles like KOP Rail and I-95 expansion





THE FIGHT AHEAD

 We know opposition already exists to the Governor's unambitious number, and our agencies themselves aren't aspiring to service restoration nor expansion

- That's why it's up to us!
 - No one else is making this demand, so we must organize to move the frame of conversation to what riders and operators need



RESPONDING TO LOCAL DEMAND

- Rep McNeill in the Lehigh Valley has proposed a study for a new grant program for midsize and growing regions for transit expansion
- At PennDOT's budget hearings, Rep Mako and Rep Nelson explicitly asked about distribution of the Public Transportation Trust Fund
 - We agree that small, and growing midsize communities need an extra boost in their support of mobility for elders, people with disabilities, and workforce needs
